## **Decoding Indian Democracy**

The recently concluded Indian election was the biggest in the world in terms of its scale, efforts to organise it, and the time and money spent on it. 900 million people were eligible to vote for 2019 general elections and about 550 million people voted in 7 phases that lasted for nearly 2 months. This giant election needed an infrastructural support of 1 million polling booths and 10 million polling officers. Indian democracy is vibrant, strong and diverse; yet it is complicated to understand. Elections are a small part of the democratic system. This conference will reflect upon critical aspects of Indian democracy and polity.
